In 2024, across numerous special programs and events, Salzburg Global will "Look East." This year, we will explore the drivers and dynamics that will influence the next decades of global cooperation and potential conflict, all of which will be significantly shaped by developments in the Asia-Pacific.

In "Looking East," Salzburg Global's objective is to help understand and navigate the assumptions and expectations between cultures and societies in ways that open new possibilities for dialogue, confront entrenched narratives, and reconcile differences. In addition, we aim to support open dialogue and engagement between and among geopolitical competitors during an era of growing distrust and rising concern over potential conflicts.

Through a range of special programs and events, we will explore issues ranging from potential confrontations over sovereignty and selfdetermination to economic stability to the future of democracy, the rapid advance of AI and other new technologies, and the increasing seriousness of the climate crisis.
